I also don't get transmission on parts of the Pacific Highway when I drive to Sydney.

The idea of a wireless only internet facility makes my blood run cold. Fibre to the nod is the way to go and I have consistently supported my Federal parliamentary member Rob Oakshott who understands that we need this facility because of our topography and because it is the only way to connect regional Australia.
