Australia's international research collaboration Public hearing in Canberra

The House of Representatives Industry, Science and Innovation Committee will conduct its sixth public hearing for its inquiry into Australia's international research collaboration on Wednesday.

Representatives of the **Australian Academy of Science** and **CSIRO** will discuss the nature of existing collaboration, the benefits of international scientific collaboration, impediments to successful collaboration, and strategies for supporting international research engagement. The Academy of Science promotes science through a range of activities and operates an international scientific collaborations program to improve Australian access to global science and technology in North America, Europe and North East Asia. CSIRO is Australia's national science agency and one of the largest and most diverse research agencies in the world.

The inquiry is examining areas of research that can deliver many benefits to Australia and its international research partners.

"International research collaboration delivers tangible benefits to many stakeholders, both in Australia and overseas, reducing costs and sharing in expertise", Committee Chair Maria Vamvakinou said.

"This inquiry focuses on understanding how Australian scientists collaborate with colleagues overseas, and is looking at ways international research collaborations can be better supported".
