1. Please provide your thoughts on future funding of regional programs in order to invest in genuine and accountable community infrastructure projects.
 Must ensure that smaller Rural and Remote Communities are not disadvantaged in terms of eligibility for Regional Funding, otherwise their ability to fund facilities for their communities will be severely hampered.
Ensure that guidelines for funding are not focussed on larger Regional Urban areas.
 It is essential that Rural and Remote areas are supported in their endeavours to plan for required infrastructure to ensure that genuine needs are identified, further developed and refined through to project completion.
 Continue to encourage the aspect of financial 'partnerships' from various groups and funding sources for the proposed new program to ensure viability of projects.
 The application form for similar funding program in the future be simplified without repetition while still encouraging a focus on specific areas of the projects.
 Maintain the reporting and acquittal processes as for the old regional partnerships program.
2. How should the Federal Government design regional programs in a way to minimise administrative costs and duplication for taxpayers.
 The regional programs should ensure that there is a local input and support the involvement of people who are familiar with the situation of the local community and their needs in terms of specific projects. This will assist with the assurance that projects are genuine, viable, sustainable and ultimately successful.
