## Response to the recommendation

## **Recommendation No 7 paragraph 7.76**

The Department of Finance and Administration raise the level of agency accountability for their Special Accounts by developing appropriate Special Account management standards to complement the Finance Guidelines for the Management of Special Accounts.

For each Special Account they administer, agencies be required to report annually to the Department of Finance and Administration that they have complied with these standards.

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The Department of Finance and Administration (the Department) supports the recommendation.

The Department will develop a list of Special Account management standards and seek annual certification of those standards by agencies. The checklist of management standards will be distributed to agencies operating Special Accounts. Agencies will then be asked to complete and certify the checklist after the end of the 2004-05 financial year, and following the end of each subsequent year.

The Department will also continue to provide regular reports to agencies, specifying the Special Accounts in operation and reminding entities of the need to comply withthe relevant legislation and guidelines.

While it remains the responsibility of agencies to properly administer their Special Accounts, it is expected that this measure will contribute to increased compliance with the legislative requirements.
