INDIGENOUS LAW AND JUSTICE INQUIRY: PUBLIC HEARING IN DARWIN ON WEDNESDAY, 21 JULY

Parliament's Public Accounts and Audit Committee will hold a public hearing into Indigenous Law and Justice on Wednesday, 21 July at the Litchfield Room in Parliament House, Darwin.

The Committee will hear from witnesses, including representatives of an Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Legal Service and a Family Violence Prevention Legal Service that operate across the Top End area of the Northern Territory, the local ATSIC Regional Council, the Northern Territory Legal Aid Commission and the Law Society Northern Territory.

Public Accounts and Audit Committee Chairman, Mr Bob Charles MP, said: "The Committee is focusing on the access of legal services to Indigenous women, youth and children in domestic violence and family law matters."

"Many different types of organisations, including Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Legal Services, Family Violence Prevention Legal Services, Legal Aid Commissions and an array of generalist and specialist community legal services, provide legal services to Indigenous people. The Committee is concerned to see that service providers complement one another to ensure that the distribution of legal services is as adequate as limited resources permit."

"This is the third hearing in a program that will see the Committee take evidence on the provision of legal services to Indigenous people around the country."

Further hearings are scheduled in Alice Springs on 22 July and in Adelaide on 19 August.
