On page 19 of the "Proof Copy" of Hansard, Senator Moore asked the following:

My previous question about internal reviews and audit processes was going to be picked up before the witnesses left. One aim of this report was to look at the internal assessment processes in all your agencies. I will place it on notice rather than taking up the time of the committee. Can the committee get back from each of the departments the internal assessment and review processes that you are following? Mr Dainer said the review that Human Services did was not stimulated by this audit. That is fine, but I just want to know what internal systems you have to look at such things.

DHS Response:

- DHS has an audit committee that oversights the internal audit plan for the core Department, CRS Australia and Child Support Agency. The audit committee does not have responsibility for audit activity in other DHS agencies such as Centrelink and Medicare Australia.
- The internal audit plan addresses the major operational risks for DHS. It is for this reason that issues identified by the ANAO in its audit activity may already be subject to action by the Department.
