I write to clarify evidence that I gave at the Parliamentary Joint Committee on Foreign Affairs, Defence and Trade, Defence Sub-Committee Review of the 2011-2012 Defence Annual Report hearing held on 15 March 2013 concerning Defence's Base Service contracts and security on Defence premises.

In answer to a question from Senator Macdonald:

'Some of my questions you might need to take on notice. Some of them are in the line of...' (p.29, *Proof Hansard* 15 March 2013), I stated that:

"... I have currently got 22 contracts around the country that cover..."

This information was incorrect because it is an error of fact. It should read:

... I have currently got 21 contracts around the country that cover ... '

In answer to a question from Senator Ian Macdonald:

'Again, using my examples of Lavarack Barracks, if there is a barrier there that their vehicle hits and the people jump out and run at the buildings half a kilometre away, are the civilian guards able to tackle them, hold them and rest knives or bombs or whatever off them?' (p.53 of Proof Hansard 15 March 2013), I stated that:

'They are able to do that, as was demonstrated in Sydney only a few months ago.'

This information was incorrect because it does not reflect the permitted actions under relevant legislation and the entire response should read:

'They are able to do that, **provided they are acting within the boundary of existing common law**, as was demonstrated in Sydney only a few months ago.'

I apologise for any misunderstanding that may have arisen.
