Deseal/reseal spouse study

The Defence Sub-Committee of the Joint Standing Committee on Foreign Affairs, Defence and Trade has posted a link on its website to a study by Coxon and Hartley on the 'Psychological Functioning in Partners and Spouses of Deseal/Reseal Personnel'. The survey found that this group experiences elevated levels of anxiety, depression and stress when compared with a control group. As a result, it finds that 'the F-111 Deseal/Reseal program has had a deleterious effect on the psychological functioning of the spouses of the individuals involved'.

While 'only a limited number of control participants took part in the study', Coxon and Hartley suggest that the study's results are 'very robust', 'at very high levels of significance', which can 'be taken at face value'.
