International Fund for Agricultural Development Amendment Bill under scrutiny

The Foreign Affairs Sub-Committee of the Joint Standing Committee on Foreign Affairs, Defence and Trade has commenced an inquiry into whether Australia should rejoin the International Fund for Agricultural Development.

The Inquiry will be conducted under the following terms of reference:

- Whether the International Fund for Agricultural Development (IFAD) has fully addressed the concerns that were raised by the former Howard Government and which prompted Australia to withdraw from the organisation in 2004; and
- Consideration of the additional financial and human resources required by AusAID to support Australia's engagement with IFAD.

In 2004, <u>*Report 60*</u> by the Joint Standing Committee on Treaties recommended that Australia withdraw from IFAD. A discussion can be found in Chapter 5 of that report; further discussion can also be found in the dissenting report.
