Average student visa processing times for Malaysians

During both the 2004-05 and 2005-06 programme years, the average (median) processing time for finalising student visa applications lodged by Malaysian passport holders was six days.

Details of the various student risk assessment levels

Form 1219i Overseas Student Programme - Assessment Levels is attached. This form sets out the student risk assessment levels applicable to all overseas passport holders.

Visitor overstayer statistics for Malaysians - absolute and percentages, including comparisons to global figures

The estimated numbers of Malaysian visitors who have overstayed their visitor visas during the last three programme years are detailed in the table below. The reported Estimated Overstayers Rate is obtained by dividing the estimated number of overstayers by the number of visitor arrivals whose visas have ceased in the reporting period. The table also contains global estimated overstayer data for comparative purposes.

Number of Malaysian visitors arriving on ETAs turned back on arrival in Australia

In the 2006-07 to 31 December, 250 Malaysian Electronic Travel Authority (ETA) holders were refused entry on arrival in Australia.

For the full year 2005-06, there were 599 Malaysian passport holders refused entry on arrival in Australia, and in 2004-05 there were 541 Malaysian passport holders refused entry.

Currently available data cannot accurately confirm how many of the Malaysian passport holders refused entry during these latter two programme years were the holders of an ETA.

The number of Malaysians at the AIS on sport visas

No Malaysian passport holders have been granted Sport visas.

Malaysian people smuggling legislation

Malaysia does not have legislation specific to people smuggling or trafficking in persons. Other legislation is applied, depending on the circumstances and nature of the offence. Current legislation includes the Penal Code, the Child Act, the Women and Girls Protection Act, the Emergency Ordinance and the Restricted Residence Act, and the Internal Security Act (ISA) and the Immigration Act. Malaysia has signed the ASEAN Declaration Against Trafficking in Persons Particularly Women and Children, which focuses on police cooperation and intelligence sharing.

The table on the next page lists passports held in alphabetical order. To identify the Assessment Level for your visa application, match your passport type with the visa subclass for the education sector of your principal course.

Note: Passports not listed in the table are Assessment Level 3, unless you are sponsored by AusAID or Defence.
