Concern has been expressed by the RUSI of Victoria Council at the reduction in the number of vessels that are Australian owned, registered and crewed. For an island nation that is dependent upon external trade, Australia has a very small merchant marine. Should we require to use merchant ships in support of our maritime strategy, cf Britain in the Falklands campaign, there would appear to be insufficient Australian owned, registered and crewed ships of the appropriate type that can be called on. Should this be the case, pursuit of a maritime strategy must also include government policy to ensure the adequacy of our merchant marine to support
