

## Overseas representation inquiry: Department of Foreign Affairs and Trade to reappear

The Department of Foreign Affairs and Trade will discuss how Australia's diplomatic presence can better meet the country's needs when it reappears before Parliament's Foreign Affairs, Defence and Trade committee on Monday 19 March.

Foreign Affairs Sub-Committee chair Mr Nick Champion MP said the committee will discuss a number of issues which have arisen during its inquiry into Australia's overseas representation with department secretary Mr Dennis Richardson.

"A general theme throughout the inquiry is that Australia's diplomatic footprint does not meet Australia's needs in the 21st century," Mr Champion said. "There have been a number of suggestions as to where new diplomatic posts should be opened, but few suggestions where posts should be closed.

"At issue is how, in times of budgetary constraint, such demands can be met and whether there should be a radical rethink of where Australia should be represented and whether the traditional embassy meets the demands of a modern high technology world.

"The committee has sought additional information from DFAT on its staffing numbers, separation rates and language skills," Mr Champion said. "Such factors influence the corporate knowledge of the Department and its ability to adequately represent Australia abroad."

DFAT's use of information and communications technology has also been raised in evidence.

"The Lowy Institute has criticised DFAT's media guidelines as being too restrictive and recommends they be reviewed. It has also commented on the quality of DFAT's websites. The hearing will allow DFAT to respond to these and other criticisms and comments."
