Human Rights Committee examines modern day slavery

Australia's efforts to address slavery, slavery-like conditions and trafficking in persons will be on the agenda at public hearings of federal parliament's Joint Standing Committee on Foreign Affairs, Defence and Trade on 20 and 21 November in Canberra.

Human Rights Sub-Committee chair, Melissa Parke, says the committee wants to examine Australia's efforts to prevent these heinous crimes both domestically and internationally.

"These public hearings will enable the committee to gauge the extent of modern day slavery, look at how victims are protected, the services that are provided as part of victim support and how to effectively prosecute and appropriately punish the offenders," Ms Parke said.

"We need to work collaboratively across governments within Australia and abroad, and with businesses and individuals to drastically reduce instances of slavery and trafficking. Active involvement by all these groups is a key component to combatting modern day slavery."

The witnesses will include the Department of Industry, Innovation, Science, Research and Tertiary Education; Department of Immigration and Citizenship; Department of Families, Housing, Community Services and Indigenous Affairs; Commonwealth Director of Public Prosecutions: the Australian Institute of Criminology: the Law Council of Australia; Fair Work Ombudsman and a number of NGOs.

The public hearings will be on Tuesday, 20 November 2012 and Wednesday, 21 November 2012 from 9.00 am in Committee Room 1R4, Parliament House, Canberra.
