## Support for Constitutional Recognition

I refer to correspondence from the Australian Local Government Association updating Council on the progress of the campaign to achieve constitutional recognition and advising that the Joint Select Committee on the Constitutional Recognition of Local Government (the Joint Select Committee) has been established to consider the proposal.

At South Burnett Regional Council's meeting held on 19 December 2012, Minute Number 6726, Council unanimously passed a resolution declaring its support for recognition of Local government in the Australian Constitution.

Council is now forwarding its submission to Joint Select Committee to advise that:

- Council fully supports the Federal Government having the power to be able to provide funding directly to local government where this is in the national interest;
- Council needs certainty of funding so that programs like Roads to Recovery can continue;
- Council supports an amendment to Section 96 of the Constitution so that it would read: "Parliament may grant financial assistance to any state or local government body formed by or under a law of a state or territory";
- Council considers bi-partisan support is an essential precondition if a referendum is to have the best chance of success;
- Council supports the referendum being held at a time which maximizes its chance of success; and
