Dear Mr. Thomson.

I saw your letter in the Moonee Valley Leader of 14 July 2008. — Have you say.

There is no doubt that we have a very serious problem with the warming of the earth's atmosphere. It is rapid and is due to the activities of people on our planet. It is in my view a significantly bigger problem than I have read or heard about from any source. It is so bad that it presages a total collapse of our world population and civilization within the space of three decades at the most. Indeed I think that an extrapolation of the growing build up of carbon dioxide in the atmosphere could — will lead to climate conditions worldwide that will make life extremely difficult in just ten years from now. Another twenty years will lead to near total collapse of the world's biological system.

Given the selfishness of individuals & national governments, to deal with the problem will be difficult. It needs a global agreement, an over-arching authority to enforce regulations on all, to protect us all.

We need to be fairly certain that what we do will be beneficial. To study the problem, but not for so long, that this leads to no actions. Basically we know the major causes of global warming. The time to act is now and hope it is not too late.

As people have caused the problem we need

1) Fewer people in the world.

As the rich consume most we need to

2) Cut consumption for everyone to save resources

We are running out of resources. We take
desire substances out of or from the surface of
the world. Mix them up and create poison to
be disposed in land fill or the oceans.

We are depleting so much of our mineral and
biological resources.

The burning of fuels that release CO₂ and
other gasses is a problem. But so is destruction of
the soil, which it self releases huge amounts of CO₂
and leaves less fertile soil for use in the future.

Peasant agriculture preserved the soil far more
efficiently than we do with our modern methods.
It produced about twice the energy than it
consumed. Our modern agriculture destroys and
gives an appalling low rate of return. The

four barrels of oil equivalent per year to feed one
resident of the U.S.A. Other ~~societies~~ societies are not
so profligate with energy, but the situation
remains; we are essentially destroying not producing.
That our modern economy is destructive has been
known for decades.

There are still those who for reasons of their
own deny that there is any such thing as global

So we must act. It huge task. At least I
believe parliamentarians are more intelligent,
honest and somewhat less selfish than the average
person. Please keep buggering. What Australia can
do will have but a small impact. But it could
be a "light on the hill". If all nations try we
could yet save the world. I am not hopeful,
but any small gain made will be for the good.
