Dear Dr Southcott

I refer to my letter of 3 May 2004 making a submission on behalf of the ACT Government to the Joint Standing Committee on Treaties regarding the Australia-United States Free Trade Agreement (AUSFTA).

The ACT Government has decided to participate in the Government Procurement Chapter of the AUSFTA.

However, I must emphasise that the ACT Government's participation does not constitute an endorsement of the agreement as a whole.

As I expressed in the ACT Government's submission to the Joint Committee, I consider that the AUSFTA is disappointing in many respects and falls significantly short of the objectives declared by the Commonwealth Government at the commencement of the negotiations.

The ACT's participation in the Government Procurement Chapter of the AUSFTA, along with all other Australian States and Territories, has not been matched by comprehensive Australian access to US State government procurement markets.

The participation of only 27 US States means that the AUSFTA provides Australian companies with access to a US State-level procurement market only approximately 72% of the size of that liberalised in the US-Chile Free Trade Agreement.

This outcome is, needless to say, sub-optimal, and reflects the unbalanced nature of the final AUSFTA outcome.

The ACT Government is also concerned that the AUSFTA not undermine the ability of Australian governments to legislate in the interests of environmental protection, nor undermine the Commonwealth Government's capacity to regulate for local content in new and emerging media.

Therefore, despite our participation in the Government Procurement Chapter of the AUSFTA, the ACT Government cannot endorse the Agreement as a whole.
