to the Joint Standing Committee on
Treaties in its review of the Australia
United States Free Trade Agreement
- That the short time period between the
release of the Text of the AUSFTA Treaty
on 4 March 2004 has been insufficient
to promote public debate on:
 - the likely economic consequences of
the Treaty from official and
alternative economic models
 - the range of options available
from DFAT, DNA, the Productivity
Commission and other credible forums
on the economic implications of
the Treaty have not been used
to generate public debate on the
implications of AUSFTA
 - that no detailed schedules have
been presented on enabling legislation
required to validate the Treaty.
 - that the full legal implications
of the Treaty and the validity of
proposed enabling legislation
are unknown

that the implications of the Treaty
on the future delivery of public
and social services at all levels of
government are uncertain

that the political values of
neoliberalism inscribed onto the Treaty
may be incompatible with Australia's
legal traditions and commitment
to responsible government as the
Treaty seeks to restrict the
legislative options of the Australian
Parliament particularly on the
need for commercial accountability
in the delivery of all public services

that the use of election deadlines
in the United States and Australia
to fast track the ratification of the
Treaty is to be thoroughly condemned

that the extent of farm subsidies in
the USA on the export prospects of
Australian rural products has not
been thoroughly investigated

that the issue of GE foods in the
opening up of trade in rural
products needs to be investigated

although the cost of AUSFTA has been finalized and a signing ceremony arranged for May 2004 in Washington, it is still possible to recommend that all enabling legislation in Australia be deferred until after the 2004 Federal election as any commitment to the full ratification of the Treaty by December 2004 is arbitrary and undemocratic because of the broad scope of the Treaty and its impact on almost every aspect of Australian life.
