RE: PROPOSED BANKRUPTCY LAW CHANGES (REMOVAL OF ASSET PROTECTION RULES)

I am writing to express my concerns in relation to the proposed changes to the Bankruptcy Laws.

I understand that the Government has an issue with certain individuals who do not lodge Income Tax Returns, avoid tax and then become bankrupt. I think it may be more appropriate to increase the penalties for tax avoidance and non lodgement of Tax Returns rather than using the proposed changes to Bankruptcy Laws.
