As at 31 July 2008, the Community Care Pilot has provided assistance to 767 of the Department's most vulnerable and complex clients.

34. What is the average daily/weekly cost per person of the various community-based alternatives?

Community Detention costs per person average at \$124 per day. This includes the costs incurred by the Australian Red Cross on behalf of clients such as financial support (for food, clothing, utilities), rent assistance and where applicable, education costs for children at the local public school.

For the period from 1 July 2007 to 30 June 2008, there were, on average, 48 people in Community Detention at any time. This figure is derived from an average of once-weekly totals over the period.
