Celebrating diversity in Sydney's west

Parramatta is the economic centre of multicultural Western Sydney. Bounded by Blacktown to the north, Bankstown in the east, Fairfield and Liverpool to the south, and Penrith to the west, the Parramatta Holroyd region is one of the most culturally diverse in Australia with over 130 cultures represented.

On **Monday 24 October 2011**, the Joint Standing Committee on Migration will visit Parramatta to hear about multiculturalism and productive diversity in Sydney's west.

The Committee Chair Ms Maria Vamvakinou stated: "Parramatta is the capital of New South Wales' vibrant and productive Indian community. The city is known for its annual South East Asian Arts **Parramasala Festival** and for its famous 'Eat Street' of international cuisines, a host location to this year's *Crave Sydney International Food Festival*."

"Parramatta is less well known for its **Diversity Health Institute**, a national forum and centre for NSW's unique multicultural mental health services model," Ms Vamvakinou said. "The Committee looks forward to hearing from the Institute director and centre managers, who are experts in transcultural mental health and problem gambling."

Parramatta City Council will open the public hearing program, to include representations from adjoining **Fairfield City**, which has a high percentage of Iraqi refugees. Other community associations and service providers appearing will be the:
