Thank you for inviting submissions regarding the Federal Parliament Migration Committee inquiry into multiculturism in Australia.

If the adoption of multiculturism in Australia undermines or devalues the Christian values on which our Constitution was founded and the formation of our legal system, I would, with respect, oppose in the strongest possible terms any move to introduce multiculturism.
