SUBMISSION AGAINST DIVISIVE MULTICULTURALISM

Multiculturalism is by nature divisive, rather than unifying.

In the past 200 years Australian culture has been unifying, whilst very appreciative of the quaintness of other cultures.

We have such a wonderful Australia and it is multiculturalism that is spoiling the good that we have had.
