Immigrants who wish to become citizens of Australia should be made to take the oath – whether it be on The New Testament, The Old Testament or The Koran - that they give their allegiance to Australia, The Flag, The Rule of Law of Australia.

Furthermore, before being admitted as a Citizen of Australia, they should be able to read and speak English, have basic knowledge of the geography and history of Australia.

They should sign a pledge that they will not enforce their religious laws where they are contrary to Australian law.

They should acknowledge that face covering in public is not Australian and should not be tolerated. What they do in the privacy of their own home is their business.

The term "Multiculturalism" is a problem in itself. It promotes and encourages certain ethnic groups to practice their culture at the expense of other people's rights and freedom. We should not be encouraging Multiculturalism to this extent – we should be encouraging Multireligiosity whereby different ethnic groups are allowed to practice and follow their own religion without fear and intimidation and not to force those ideologies on others.
