I wish to record our concerns with regard to the present government's reinstatement of the doctrine of multiculturalism in Australia.

1. This nation was a peaceful and desirable place in which to live thanks largely to its inherited British institutions based on their Judeo/Christian foundation and the encouragement of immigrants to learn English and assimilate as much as possible.

5. Please do not allow large numbers of these people to enter and gain citizenship, much less encourage them to continue to feel that is perfectly alright for them to seek to change our laws to suit their culture.
