Dear Sirs and Mesdames,

Given the blatant bias, half-truths, and the cynical pursuit of the Committee's own agenda as set out in part one of your report, I shall not go into any detail about how Norfolk Island might manage its financial affairs better; I do not expect that you will take the slightest notice of the opinions of any but your stable of pusillanimous agents of influence who hide behind a cloak of anonymity. Therefore, a few brief suggestions:

- 1. Have the Norfolk Island Government increase its import duty on luxury items for home use or consumption.
- 2. Privatise the N.I. Government enterprises that are not run efficiently, whilst ensuring that the N.I. Government has enough legislative control to prevent excessive profiteering.
- 3. Grant the N.I. Government the right to lease the fishing and oil exploration rights in our 200-mile EEZ.

- 5. Help, rather than obstruct, the N.I. Government to establish Norfolk Island as an offshore financial centre.
- Convince the Commonwealth Government to ablate the \$3 million loan advanced for fixing the Cascade cliff. According to a 1926 Commonwealth report, this job should have been done by the Commonwealth back in 1926.
- 7. As the Commonwealth of Australia regards our airport as highly strategic, let the Commonwealth Government pay in full for all upgrades.
- 8. Put an end to the seemingly endless parade of Australian Parliamentary Select, Joint and Standover Committees sent to Norfolk Island to harass the local people and the **elected** Government of Norfolk Island. They cost us a great deal of our money with no benefit to us, just a lot of frustration.
