'Not all about carrots, pumpkins and peas'

ON Monday I attended a meeting at the Boonah Council Chambers inquiring into 'Future Water Supplies for Australia's Rural Industries and Communities'. Boonah Shire Council spoke to a submission, and while the case was soundly argued, I was disappointed not to hear even a passing reference to the Tourist Industry in our Shire. While I am aware that the

terms of reference do not specifically mention tourism, in this shire it is very closely related to water.

It is not all about carrots and pumpkins and peas. Properly managed tourism may even overtake other forms of income, but persistently empty dams will not help the cause.

Let me point out a few facts, especially relating to Lake Moogerah which indisputably is the jewel in the crown of our Shire's tourist industry.

1. There are four camps around Lake Moogerah, and collectively they receive 9,600 visitors each year, both adult and youth.

2. Easter weekend at the Lake Moogerah Caravan park can see 3 - 4,000 visitors.

3. Skiers, fishermen, canoeists and their associated clubs constitute large numbers of people, apart from the usual weekend trippers and campers.

4. If the plans of the Moogerah Passion Play come to fruition we anticipate 15,000 people annually will visit our Christian Theme Park.

An enormous dollar sign has (quite rightly) been put over water in recent times, it is a substance that we have never really cherished as much as we do now, but in our haste to apportion it let us remember two things. The first is that an equally big dollar sign hangs over the tourist industry as over irrigation, and the second is that man does not live by bread alone - water can be very nourishing to the soul.
