ABC Melbourne Accommodation Project

You have asked us to consider whether there is any risk that native title could be found to exist in respect of the land at 102-118 Sturt Street, Southbank ("the site"). Our response to your question is set out below.

NATIVE TITLE CLAIMS

We have undertaken a search of the Native Title Vision service provided by the National Native Title Tribunal. This mapping tool identifies area of land that are subject to (amongst other things) an application for a determination that native title exists, together with areas where native title has been determined to exist.

We attach to this letter a map depicting the area in which the site is located. As you can see, there have been no determinations of native title in respect of the site, nor are there any outstanding applications in respect of the site. On the basis of this map we confirm that the site area is not subject to any native title claims or determinations.

LAND TENURE

We have also conducted current and historical title searches of the site. The copies of both search results are attached to this letter. From the original title contained in the search results, you will note that an estate in fee simple was granted on 23 May 1988. The grant of this interest is classified as a *previous exclusive possession act* under s 23B of the *Native Title Act 1993* (Cth) because it occurred before 23 December 1996 and constituted a grant of freehold estate.

The grant of an interest that amounts to a previous exclusive possession act has the effect of completely extinguishing any native title rights that persisted in the site. We have not examined the earlier history of the land tenure at the site but is likely that native title was in fact extinguished prior to this grant, by some earlier dealing in the site that was inconsistent with native title.

In any event, native title has now been extinguished, and so there is no risk of a successful native title application being lodged in the future.

Thank you for your letter dated 4 April 2013 advising of the proposed redevelopment to consolidate administrative and television production functions into a new expanded and state of the art facility at the ABC Centre Southbank. I confirm that both I and officers of my department have had several discussions with you and your consultant representatives regarding this matter.

Submission re: Proposed ABC Melbourne New Office and Studio Accommodation Project 102 – 118 Sturt Street Southbank: Melbourne Accommodation Project

Friends of the ABC (FABC) is the major community organisation representing the public's interest in its national independent broadcaster.

We wish to inform you of FABC's strong support for the ABC's proposal to extend its Victorian Southbank facility, which will replace its existing Ripponlea television operations.

Friends of the ABC submits that:

- . The ABC's existing facilities at Ripponlea are aged and inadequate for the operations of a modern public broadcaster.
- ABC facilities in Melbourne need to be upgraded and improved if the ABC is to fulfil its responsibilities as a truly national broadcaster which reflects the interests of Australians in all states and territories.
- Common sense suggests that it would be more efficient and effective for all of ABC Victoria's metropolitan and national operations to be located in a single place, and particularly as media convergence is resulting in content frequently being developed and adapted for more than a single media delivery platform.
- Creativity is enhanced by the informal personal interaction, exchange of information and ideas that result when people work in close physical proximity to each other.
- . The location of television studio facilities at Southbank, which is nearer to Melbourne city, would provide better access for visitors to all parts of the ABC in Melbourne, and for the community to view and participate in the production of ABC programs.

As a producer and provider of independent information and content that maintains our local culture, the ABC plays a vital role in the life of the country. Its prominent presence has become critical as the result of Australia's dangerously high level of media ownership concentration and the failure of the business model which supported the commercial media.

FABC requests the favourable consideration and support of the Committee for the ABC's Melbourne Accommodation Project proposal.

I write in support of the proposed ABC Melbourne New Office and Studio Accommodation Project.

As you are aware, I have had a very close working relationship with the ABC over the last 15 years. Firstly, in my role as the Victorian Emergency Services Commissioner from 2000 to 2010, and more recently in my role as Deputy Chairman of the board of Regional Arts Victoria and board member of the Melbourne Chamber Orchestra.

The ABC role as emergency broadcaster has become a vital role for commentates before during and after the seemingly increasingly frequent emergency events effecting Victoria. It is also a role that places a particularly heavy burden on ABC Victoria, both in terms of the accuracy and timeliness of the information broadcast, but also in terms of the huge demands it makes on ABC staff and management to maintain this absolutely critical public service, frequently on a round the clock basis for sometimes weeks at a time.

In my professional opinion, this demand will only increase incoming years.

Having all ABC staff from radio, television and other new media collocated in a new Southbank facility will facilitate this work being done more effectively and more efficiently. Again, in my opinion, as new media develops and the potential benefits of it are realized, the take up by the community will increase exponentially.

The demands on ABC to be at the forefront of not only developments in traditional emergency broadcasting, but also lead the application of new media to emergency broadcasting will be significant.

Having all Melbourne staff, studios and production facilities located at Southbank should provide the far more effective and flexible working environment necessary in an environment of converging media.
