Public Works Committee inquires into new DHS premises

The Public Works Committee is conducting an inquiry into the proposed fit out of new leased premises for the Human Services Portfolio at Greenway, ACT.

The Department of Human Services has submitted its proposal for the fit out of a new building for departmental staff. The proposed fit out will enable approximately 90 per cent of the portfolio's national office staff to co-locate into sites in the Tuggeranong Town Centre precinct. The department will be able to relinquish a number of smaller leases across the ACT. The total value of the proposed works is \$38.55 million.

The proposed scope of the works for the fit out of the new building will be based on the department's accommodation guidelines, and will include: one major entry reception/security control point; a flexible modular office design; enclosed offices and open plan workstations; meeting, break out and carers rooms; first aid rooms and a prayer room; resource rooms and shared storage; lockers and bicycle racks; and a café.

If Parliamentary approval is given, the fit out design will commence in September 2011, and the building will be ready for occupation in June 2013.

The Public Works Committee is responsible for ensuring that the need, cost and scope proposed is appropriate.

'This proposal would represent a significant consolidation of departmental staff to a new, purpose-built, central facility,' Ms Saffin said. 'The Committee is concerned to ensure that the proposed works will meet the current and future needs of DHS, and that the Commonwealth is getting value for money.'
