## Public hearings in Queensland for Indigenous employment inquiry

The House of Representatives Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Affairs Committee will begin a three day program of public hearings and inspections this week in Queensland as part of its inquiry into Indigenous employment.

The Committee is looking at positive Indigenous employment outcomes with a view to informing future policy development.

Committee Chairman Barry Wakelin says the Committee wants to investigate how Queensland is creating new job opportunities for Indigenous people.

"We look forward to hearing about the important factors that have contributed to Indigenous employment successes in Queensland and how best to work with Indigenous communities to create more employment opportunities," Mr Wakelin said.

Public hearings will be held in Cairns on Thursday 28 July 2005 and in Brisbane on Friday, 29 July 2005. The Committee will hear from a number of organisations, including the Tjapukai Aboriginal Cultural Park; Cairns Regional Community Development & Employment ATSI Corporation; Cairns City Council; Indigenous Enterprise Partnerships; Cairns Region Group Training; Queensland Government; Brisbane City Council; Caboolture Shire Council, Purga Elders and Descendents Aboriginal Corporation and Bluefin Seafoods.

The Committee will continue to receive submissions and interested persons and organisations are encouraged to contact the secretariat if they wish to participate in the inquiry.
