Dear Ms Kelly

Thank you for your letter dated 27 January 2006, inviting a submission from the Government of Western Australia with regard to the Community Broadcasting Inquiry. In the face of increasing globalisation, the inquiry by the Standing Committee on Communications, Information Technology and the Arts is welcomed as a means for identifying how to better assist communities to share their local news and stories.

Community broadcasting in Western Australia falls within the auspice of the Government Media Office (GMO). I have notified the GMO of your Inquiry.

In 2005, the Department of Culture and the Arts (DCA) managed a one-off grants program (on behalf of the GMO) to provide support for this sector. The Community and Ethnic Media (CEM) Grants Program provided support to innovative programming and/or special capital costs. Through this fund, community, Indigenous and ethnic media outlets throughout Western Australia received a boost of more than \$1million in grants.

Based on the funding requests received, it became apparent that the sector is seeking assistance in areas such as:

- equipment and infrastructure upgrades/purchases (and user training);
- development of new programs such as community news, information, arts achievements and events, for television, radio and/or internet broadcast.

Of the 52 applications received, 16 organisations with proven track records in the development and delivery of community, Indigenous or ethnic media received funding. Of these, nine organisations were outside of the Perth metropolitan area.

Notably, a special grant of \$665,216 was made to community television station Access 31 for infrastructure requirements and local program development. Access 31 broadcasts in Perth, Bunbury and Albany, and focuses on local programming, local talent and coverage of local events. The channel is an important showcase for WA's rapidly growing film, music and drama industries.
