Roundtable to discuss proposals for reforming electoral financing arrangements

Federal parliament's Electoral Matters Committee will hold a roundtable in Canberra tomorrow, 16 April 2009, as part of its inquiry into the 2007 election and related matters.

The roundtable will examine proposals that are included in the government's electoral reform green paper on donations, funding and expenditure.

"It is generally acknowledged that current arrangements need fixing, with the spiralling costs of electioneering creating a campaigning 'arms race' that increase fundraising pressures on political parties and candidates", committee chair Daryl Melham (Member for Banks, NSW) said.

Participants in the roundtable include:

- Former Senator for Western Australia Andrew Murray;
- Academics with an interest in electoral financing including Professor George Williams (UNSW), Professor Brian Costar (Swinburne University) and Dr Peter Brent (ANU); and
- Representative organisations the Wilderness Society, the CFMEU, Action on Smoking and Health Australia and the Public Interest Advocacy Centre.
