Women to have their say on work and family

The needs of women in balancing work and family will be the focus of a public hearing to be held by the House Families Committee in Adelaide tomorrow (Thursday 4 May 2006).

Many of the witnesses will give a women's perspective on issues such as:

- women being asked at job interviews about their intentions to have families;
- women being discouraged from talking about their families at work;
- whether effective marginal tax rates make it financially rewarding for women to take up part time work; and
- the lower levels of employment among single women, compared with partnered women.

Committee Chairman Bronwyn Bishop said,"Many women today not only play a key role in the household, but they also need to earn a salary to help support their family. We have received evidence that many women cannot find a flexible employer or access quality child care. It's no wonder our fertility rate is 1.75."

"The average preferred family size for Australian women is 2.5," Mrs Bishop said. "We need to listen to women to develop the sorts of policies so that two or more children can be their reality, not just a dream."
