Public Hearing into the Telecommunications Amendment (Enhancing Community Consultation) Bill

The House Standing Committee on Infrastructure and Communications will hold a public hearing on **17 February 2012** in **Canberra** as part of its inquiry into the Telecommunications Amendment (Enhancing Community Consultation) Bill 2011.

The Bill proposes 12 amendments to the Telecommunications Act 1997, most of which relate to the roll-out of 'low impact' mobile telecommunications infrastructure. The Bill seeks to impose more stringent safety, siting and consultation requirements on telecommunications companies and their contractors.

The Committee chair, Ms Sharon Bird, said "The committee has received more than 70 submissions to this inquiry from community groups and industry stakeholders, indicating a significant level of interest in the topic. The inquiry has highlighted the difficulty of striking the right balance between community concerns about health and visual amenity on the one hand, and an expectation of world-class telecommunications infrastructure on the other. We look forward to hearing more about these issues at the hearing."
