Telco's have long been very keen on situating a 50m high impact phone tower at Point Walter, Bicton WA. Despite this being a recognized A Class Reserve of immense importance to all residents and the broader community.

The Teleo's that have continually applied for a fligh Impact Phone Tower in this location go against the provisions stated in the Telecommunications flet which clearly stipulates avoidance of areas classed as 'sensitive'. Point Walter most certainly is for several reasons including; A Class status, local Play Group within 300m, Aboriginal significance, residents houses with in 300m and hugely impacting the amenity of this natural area.

The total and blatant disregard for the impact this infrastructure imposes on communities is absolutely staggering.

Teleo's are a law unto themselves with little if any support given to the community by the current legislation. It is a very sad indictment of the government's lack of concern in this area.

Legislation needs to be changed today to provide protection for all in the community and the environment.
