As a former Shire Councilor and now a ratepayer in the Baw Baw Shire I wish to make a submission to your Committee on the question of Constitutional Recognition of Local Government. I note that most local Councils are supporting this referendum. They have been encouraged to think they will get more money from the Federal Government.

Local Councils have been pressured by COAG and in Victoria by The MAV. COAG was funded to present the "yes" case only, and it is controlled by the Prime Minister anyway. The MAV is heavily committed to the policies of Agenda 21, a centralist orientated entity.
