Submission - Constitutional Recognition of Local Government

This submission is made on behalf of East Gippsland Shire Council to the Joint Select Committee on the Constitutional Recognition of Local Government.

Local government is an essential part of Australia's system of government. Its contribution to national wellbeing can be measured in economic and social terms, and more intangibly by the way it enhances the democratic way of life of Australian citizens. It should be recognised in our national Constitution, alongside the State, Territory and Australian governments.

The inclusion of Local Government in the constitution is about recognising its role in Australia's democratic system of government and securing funding sources to deliver the essential services our communities need.

In order to carry out its responsibilities, Local Government relies on a range of funding sources, including its own revenue streams, grants from State and Territory governments, and funding from the Australian government. In 2009, a High Court decision (*Pape vs Federal Commissioner of Taxation*) brought into serious doubt the Australian Government's ability under the Constitution to directly fund Local Government projects.

As a consequence, East Gippsland Shire Council supports a Constitutional referendum on empowering the Australian Government to directly fund Local Government authorities, to put beyond doubt its ability to fund vital local projects.

Specifically, Council supports an amendment to Section 96 of the Constitution to proclaim: "Parliament may grant financial assistance to any State or Local Government body formed by or under a law of a State or Territory".

Recognition of Local Government in the Australian Constitution will provide the Australian Government with legal authority to provide funding directly to Local Government where this is in the national interest. Funding of Local Government Councils by the Australian Government must be secured, to ensure the invaluable outcomes made possible through programs such as Roads to Recovery and the Regional and Local Community Infrastructure Program, or their equivalents, can continue.
