AFFA to appear at inquiry into future water supplies for Australia's rural industries and communities

Public hearing in Canberra, Wednesday 13 August, 2003

The House of Representatives Agriculture Committee is examining the role of the Commonwealth in ensuring adequate and sustainable future water supplies for communities and industries in rural and regional Australia.

This Wednesday (13 August) the committee will conduct the eighteenth public hearing of its inquiry. Appearing will be representatives of the Department of Agriculture, Fisheries & Forestry - Australia. AFFA is the Commonwealth Department responsible for natural resource management and water issues.

AFFA's submission (No. 160 on the inquiry web site) asserts that "many of Australia's water resources are now under significant pressure...the agricultural sector is under pressure to reduce levels of extraction in areas of over allocation and allocate more water to the environment".

The submission continues: "Effective management of our water resources is therefore vital to ensure the demands from urban, industrial and agricultural water users and the environment are balanced to ensure the sustainability of our rivers and protect our future water supplies."

The Committee Chair, Mrs Kay Elson MP, says the inquiry has generated considerable interest around Australia, with more than 160 submissions received from concerned organisations and individuals.
