

Inquiry into future water supplies for Australia's rural industries and communities

Public hearing in Canberra, 26 March 2003

The House of Representatives Agriculture Committee is examining the role of the Commonwealth in ensuring adequate and sustainable future water supplies for communities and industries in rural and regional Australia.

As part of its inquiry, the Committee will take evidence from Mr Bob Charles MP, Member for La Trobe. In his submission Mr Charles argues that the viability of a large number of tourist and leisure businesses, which develop around water storages such as Lake Eildon, is threatened when water levels drop below usable levels.

The Inquiry has generated considerable interest around Australia, with over 130 submissions received from concerned organisations and individuals.
