As part of the inquiry into the proposed Murray-Darling Basin plan, the House of Representatives Standing Committee on Regional Australia will be visiting Swan Hill in January to meet the people living and working in the Basin. The Committee wants to hear the views of the communities, understand the complexity of issues faced, and hear community solutions for the Murray-Darling River.

As part of its nine day tour of the Basin to seeing firsthand the issues faced by many farmers and surrounding communities, the Committee is also holding a series of public hearings to consult with communities. The Committee looks forward to meeting the people of Swan Hill at its third public hearing on Thursday 20 January 2011.
