## House Committee to examine the Government's green credentials

The Australian National Audit Office will outline the findings of an audit of the federal government's green office procurement programs at a public hearing in Canberra on Thursday 30 March.

The public hearing will be held at 10:30 am in Committee Room 1R4 in Parliament House.

The hearing is the first for an inquiry the House of Representatives Environment Committee into the development of a national sustainability charter.

Committee Chair Dr Mal Washer said that the inquiry will provide the federal government with information on how to proceed with the development of a national sustainability charter.

The Committee will build on the work already done by some of the states and in some other countries. It will take information from these sources and incorporate it in a report that will recommend national objectives to the federal government.

In September 2005, the Committee tabled the *Sustainable Cities* report, which called for the development of a Sustainability Charter based on measurable outcomes, over a certain period, with intermediate milestones.

"The development of a charter would be an important step forward for the nation but the committee is concerned that the audit of green procurement identified significant short comings in the federal government's management of the environmental impacts of its procurement decisions," Dr Washer said.
