## Committee investigates barriers to rural skilling in Australia

Committee Public Hearing in Parliament House, Canberra - 7 September 2005

**Dr Sandra Welsman** and representatives from the **Cattle Council of Australia (CCA)** and **Avcare** will appear before the House Standing Committee on Agriculture, Fisheries and Forestry on Wednesday (7 September) in relation to its inquiry into rural skills training and research.

The public hearing will take place from 5.00 pm in Committee Room 1R3, Parliament House, Canberra.

Dr Welsman's submission (no. 12 on the committee website) points to a City – Country divide – a 'from the land' barrier that appears to stand in the way of career-building in Agriculture. She contends that Australian agriculture risks becoming a closed culture with a shrinking pool of capable people.

Avcare's submission (no. 21 on the committee website) calls for more research into attitudinal motivators and barriers to adopting a culture of continuous improvement in managing agvet chemicals.

The committee chair, Alby Schultz (Member for Hume, NSW), said the "committee is interested in hearing from this wide range of people on the barriers to rural skilling in Australia. We are greatly interested in hearing their opinions on what the Australian Government can do to help break down some of these barriers".
