## Rural skills issues in Queensland under investigation

Committee Public Hearings in Brisbane – 10 April 2006 Toowoomba – 11 April 2006

The House of Representatives Agriculture Committee travels to Queensland next week to investigate a diverse range of rural skills issues from the challenges faced by the amalgamation of four agricultural colleges to the difficulties confronting the honeybee industry.

The committee will be holding public hearings in **Brisbane (10 April)** and **Toowoomba (11 April)** in relation to its inquiry into rural skills training and research.

The Brisbane hearings will take place from 10.00 am in the Queen's Ballroom, Brisbane Hilton, 190 Elizabeth Street.

In Brisbane the committee will hear from witnesses such as Rangelands Australia, the Queensland Rural Industry Training Council, honeybee expert Dr Max Whitten, the CSIRO, and the Queensland Government.

The Toowoomba hearings will take place from 9.00 am in the Comfort Inn Grammar View, 39 Margaret Street.

In Toowoomba the committee will hear from witnesses including AgForce Queensland, the Australasia–Pacific Extension Network, the Australian Agricultural Colleges Corporation – Dalby, Horizon Rural Management, and Conservation Farmers.

The committee chair, Alby Schultz (Member for Hume, NSW), said "the committee has received numerous submissions from Queensland and we see this as an opportunity to hear about some of the interesting developments in Queensland regarding rural training, skills and research".
