Re: Proposed Community Recreation Centre on Christmas Island - Response to the Shire of Christmas Island's submission to the Parliamentary Standing **Committee on Public Works (PWC).**

I note that in their submission, the Shire of Christmas Island has supported and been involved with various proposals and recommendations to meet the need of the recreation facilities on Christmas Island.

My reading of the Shire's submission is that the Shire has two major concerns, ie, that the Department of Transport and Regional Services did not employ a full consultation process with the community and that the Shire's request to be involved in the design/tender process was rejected by the Commonwealth.

The Department disagrees that a full consultation process was not undertaken for this project. Once the Australian Government announced that it would fund Sports and Recreation Facilities, including a Recreation Centre, an on-island advisory council was formed to assess the community's need.

The Christmas Island Administrator, through the Administrator's Advisory Council (AAC) conducted a full community consultation process prior to seeking tenders. The AAC consisted of representatives from a number of on-island organisations. These included the following organisations:

As a result of the consultation process the AAC agreed on the construction site location and concept design of the proposed Recreation Centre.

In regard to the Shire's concern at not having direct involvement in the proposed project, it is not appropriate for the Shire to be involved in the design/tender process or to be given project management responsibility.

I hope that the department has addressed the concerns of the Shire of Christmas Island. If any further explanations are required the Department will address these at the upcoming Public Hearing.
