DEPARTMENT OF DEFENCE - HOLSWORTHY STAGE 1 REDEVELOPMENT, NSW

I refer to your letter of 20 May 2005 to the Secretary of this Department inviting comment on the above proposal.

This Department administers the *Environment Protection and Biodiversity Conservation Act* 1999 (EPBC Act) on behalf of the Minister for the Environment and Heritage, Senator the Hon Ian Campbell.

The EPBC Act provides for the protection of certain defined matters of national environmental significance as well as the more general 'environment' where a development activity is to be taken by an agency of the Australian Government. Agencies are required to refer proposals with potential significant impacts on the 'environment' to this Department for consideration under the EPBC Act.

Formal assessment and approval is needed under the Act for proposals likely to have a significant impact ('controlled actions'). Proposals that are determined not likely to have a significant impact do not need any further consideration under the EPBC Act.

In this case, the Department of Defence referred the Holsworthy Redevelopment Project under the EPBC Act on 1 March 2004. A decision was made on 17 May 2005 that the works are not likely to have a significant impact on the 'environment' and that approval under the Act is therefore not needed (copy of decision attached).
