INQUIRY INTO THE MANAGEMENT AND INTEGRITY OF ELECTRONIC INFORMATION IN THE COMMONWEALTH

In response to your correspondence of 28 October 2002 to Dr Ken Henry, the following information is provided.

The Treasury has implemented and is in the process of implementing, a range of controls and processes to ensure the sound management, security and integrity of its information and records holdings. This is being achieved through a combination of on-going initiatives as part of an overall Information Management project aimed at regularising and standardising processes used for this purpose based on a corporate change-management approach.

The Treasury has identified the requirement to integrate the following activities to fully address these issues:

- Electronic and paper-based records keeping
- E-Publishing, including electronic documents and Web Site content
- IT Security technologies and preventative security practices relating to information access and Internet usage
- Privacy policies and guidelines including Copyright law compliance
- E-business relating to on-line transactions and communication with other Government Agencies, Private Industry and dealing with members of the public.
- Physical Security and Risk Management
- IT Disaster Recovery and Business Continuity planning
- Compliance with Government policies and professional standards associated with all of the above.

In support of these activities the Treasury has developed or adopted the plans, policies and guidelines listed in the Attachment.
