**Senator BUSHBY:** Does the bureau liaise with overseas research agencies in terms of what it

does?

**Prof. Grafton:** Yes, we do.

**Senator BUSHBY:** Which agencies do you continue to work with most?

**Prof. Grafton:** We have liaised with Natural Resources Canada. We are working with them on a particular project. They have particular expertise that complements our own, so we are working with them.

**Senator BUSHBY:** Would you mind taking on notice the details of that project?

**Prof. Grafton:** Certainly.

**Senator BUSHBY:** There is no need to worry about it today. Can you provide those details? That might do with the bureau.

## Answer:

The Bureau of Resources and Energy Economics (BREE) is collaborating with Natural Resources Canada (NRCan) on a number of research projects. These include the sharing of results and information on productivity in the mining sector, sharing of results on value-chain modelling, and the co-development of model(s) for long-term price projections for key mineral and energy commodities.
