Senator BUSHBY: Who is on the international advisory panel which advises the institute?

Ms Sewell: I am sorry, Senator. We do not have that information.

Senator BUSHBY: You can take that on notice. Can you tell me whether members of the international advisory panel are paid? If so, how much?

Ms Sewell: Yes. They are paid. I would have to take remuneration on notice too.

Senator BUSHBY: And whether there is any cap involved in that. When did Mr James Wolfensohn leave the international advisory panel?

Ms Sewell: It was last year, Senator. Off the top of my head, I would say about 12 months ago.

Senator BUSHBY: You do not have the date handy? Is the department aware of a letter that Mr Wolfensohn wrote to then Prime Minister Kevin Rudd when he left? It might be more than a year. When he left the international advisory panel, was a letter that was sent by him advising the Prime Minister of his resignation brought to the attention of the department?

Ms Sewell: Senator, Mr Wolfensohn was in correspondence with the Prime Minister over a number of issues. I cannot recall that specific letter, but I am happy to take it on notice.

Senator BUSHBY: If there is a letter where he advises the Prime Minister that he is leaving, can you provide the date that that letter reached the then Prime Minister?

Ms Sewell: Yes, Senator.
