## **Question:**

**Senator KITCHING:** The question was: what process is followed to determine which events the Prime Minister will agree to attend and those which he will decline?

**Senator Brandis:** You are asking me about a process that would exist within the Prime Minister's Office, and I do not personally know what that process is.

**Senator KITCHING:** But you are here representing the Prime Minister. What criteria are considered—

**Senator WONG:** You can take it on notice.

**Senator Brandis:** Do you want me to take it on notice?

**Senator KITCHING:** I would like you to take it on notice. Thank you. What criteria are considered when determining whether an event is worthy of the Prime Minister's attendance?
