## Teacher shortages in each year

## Question

Dr Baxter: That 4,000 is a cumulative total over the four years to $2025 \ldots$
Senator PRATT: Is the cumulative total for each year-
Dr Baxter: Yes, adding what there was in a particular year to the next year.
Senator PRATT: What's the overall shortage in each year over those four or five years?
Dr Baxter: I have seen a little table, Senator. I'm sorry, I don't have that here with me. But I can give it to you on notice.

## Answer

The demand for secondary school teachers is projected to exceed the supply of new graduate teachers by 4,123 teachers over 2021 to 2025 . The table shows the projected shortage for each year.
