9. Can the Minister inform the Committee the total amount of s 64(3) funds distributed by the ALC during the past 5 years? What proportion of those funds were directed to the Winchelsea Mining project either directly or for supporting infrastructure? What proportion of 64(3) funds have been directed specifically to the WMC during that same period?

Answer: -

The total amount of Aboriginal Land Rights Act NT (ALRA) section 64(3) funds distributed by the ALC to Aboriginal Corporations during the period 2020-21 to 2024-25 (year to date 28 February) is \$204,746,548.

The proportion of ALRA section 64(3) funds distributed to Anindilyakwa Advancement Aboriginal Corporation (AAAC) to directly support the Winchelsea mining project is 9.4% (\$19,340,830). Some of these funds were provided by AAAC to Winchelsea Mining Company in the form of a loan (refer to Senator David Pocock Question on Notice QRN NIAA222 dated July 2024 for details).

The proportion of ALRA section 64(3) funds distributed to Groote Holdings Aboriginal Corporation (GHAC) providing broad benefits including benefiting the Winchelsea mining project is 19.5% (\$39,944,504). The funded projects included jetty and ramp capital, Little Paradise base camp, 4G base station, Pole 7A visitor's village 15 rooms, Pole 7A kitchen, renewable energy and solar farm, Little Paradise Section 19 lease payments, marine services- capital (Centaur II), GHAC land equipment and civil fleet.

The ALC has not provided funds directly to Winchelsea Mining Company.
